Drink *Japanese flair*

If you're in the mood for a drive, head east out of Napa on a winding road up Mount George to **Kenzo Estate** winery (elevation 1,550 feet), owned by video-game pioneer Kenzo Tsujimoto. The wealthy Japanese businessman sunk \$100 million into the elegant, Bordeaux-style project, set on 4,000 gorgeous highland acres with eight natural lakes. Everything about the place exudes class, given all the Japanese hospitality. Plus, its by-appointment-only tastings come with food prepared by Thomas Keller's Bouchon Bakery in Yountville. Savor it all on an inviting terrace overlooking the vineyards.
